

EuroSIDA reimbursement 2020 - delayed.

Due to a national lockdown and a temporary change in scientific priorities, our normal activities in EuroSIDA and in cohort studies, in general, have slowed down considerably and many deadlines have been postponed.

The reimbursement process planned for May/June 2020 regrettably has to be postponed, but will of course still be made in 2020. As soon as we know when we will be able to make the reimbursement, we will inform you.



CHIP's input into SARS-CoV-2 treatment trials.

CHIP is International Coordinating Centre (ICC) and together with the London ICC, CHIP is overseeing the European arm of the Adaptive COVID-19

Treatment Trial (ACTT). The global <u>ACTT trial</u> is coordinated by the INSIGHT research network and sponsored by the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID) under NIH.

The preliminary results of the first randomised study show that people infected with the SARS-CoV-2 recover 31% faster if they receive Remdesivir.

Free webinar from Spring European Testing Week on HIV self-testing

The upcoming **Spring European Testing Week is 15-22 May** is taking place online this year. It aims to advocate and raise awareness on the importance of HIV, viral hepatitis and STI services (*in line with a recent call from UNAIDS*) through online platforms and to also share how you and your organisation is supporting your community during this global pandemic.

As part of ETW's activities, they are hosting a **FREE** live webinar next **Tuesday**, **19 May from 16:00-17:00 CEST**.

With the current global COVID-19 pandemic, interest for HIV self-testing/sampling has been rapidly increasing due to service closures and/or restrictions to in-person testing. However, in some countries, there exist gaps in knowledge on HIV self-testing/sampling where they may not be widely known or easily available.

This webinar will present case examples from Lithuania (<u>Asociacija</u> <u>Demetra</u>) and Italy (<u>Arcigay/Lila Milano</u>) where pilot activities were undertaken through the <u>INTEGRATE JA</u> (led by partners at <u>Public Health</u> <u>England</u>) to close the knowledge gaps to understand the HIV self-testing situation in both countries. These pilots implemented activities to assess awareness, usability, acceptability, availability and knowledge of self-tests and the findings will be presented in the webinar.
