Tuberculosis among HIV-infected patients in Europe

PROJECT UPDATE 2010

Last year has been a very productive year for the HIV/TB Project:

- A 2-year follow-up data collection has been completed and database is now closed. We would like to thank everybody for their contribution to the data collection process
- > Several scientific questions are currently being addressed and statistically analysed:
 - 'Causes of death among HIV/TB patients' project has been presented at IWHOD2010 (abstract #14_130) and then in more detailed analysis at AIDS2010 conference in Vienna (abstract #TUPDB302)
 - Health Care Index Score and outcome of HIV/TB patients has been presented at EACS 2009 in Cologne (abstract #P/S8/5) and the manuscript is currently being finalised
- Protocol for the prospective HIV/TB study has been developed and funding obtained from the EuroCoord!

2011

The HIV/TB project has been approved as a separate work package within the EuroCoord application and was granted a funding of 480,000 euro for a 5-year period. Alexander Panteleev, HIV/TB specialist from St. Petersburg has been selected as a leader for this work package. The prospective study of HIV-infected patients diagnosed with an active TB disease will start form January 2011. The specific objectives of this study fall into two main categories: 1) epidemiology of HIV/TB coinfection 2) clinical aspects and management of HIV/TB patients.

This will be a prospective cohort study enrolling all HIV patients who are diagnosed with TB at the participating clinics after January 1st 2011 and throughout the study period. Follow-up data would be collected on a specially designed data collection form on a 6-months basis and for a minimum of 2-yaer follow-up period. Specimens of *Mycobacteria tuberculosis* are also planned to be collected.

All study documents will soon be circulated.
