Dear Investigators of the TB:HIV study


We would like to update you on the study status and kindly remind you about approaching deadline for submission of the follow-up forms.

ENROLMENT STATUS

We thank all study investigators for their excellent work and continuous contribution to the study. Currently, there are **537** patients enrolled in the TB:HIV Study. Patients' distribution per region and goals estimated for the entire enrolment period are shown on figure 1.

Hereby we would like to encourage all investigators of the TB:HIV study to **make every effort to identify eligible patients** and enroll them as soon as possible (please send the forms to Bitten Aagaard <u>baa@cphiv.dk</u>).
