

Tuberculosis among HIV-positive patients: an international prospective observational study

Study update

The prospective phase of TB:HIV study has received funding from the European Commission Framework Package 7 (FP7), EuroCoord application work package 13 and was initiated from January 1st 2011

15 European countries agreed to participate (as listed on the right). We thank all investigators for their willingness to participate and contribute to the study!

The study is expanding to Latin America with a coordinating site in Buenos Aires, Argentina (as indicated on the right)

Based on your feedback, the estimated number of patients is app. 60% higher than was originally defined by the protocol. This is very reassuring for the study's success. The distribution of patients by region is shown on Figure 1.

Currently the most important milestones are: - Ethics approvals for all sites should be obtained - Enrolment forms for all HIV patients diagnosed with TB during January – June 2011 should be submitted to CHIP by the end of August 2011
